DECODE activities -Spring 2023

So what have the DECODE team been up to:

- Road-shows some of you may have seen us out and about in Leicestershire, publicising our project and encouraging people to take part. If you haven't got a DECODE stress ball or tote bag, come along to one of our future events.
- Data activities -Rania, Emeka and Akshika (Work Package 1 & 2) have been very busy working on one of two data sets -SAIL data (Wales GP and hospital health records), with the help of our PAP team (see below) and Swansea colleagues, Danielle and Ashley, reviewing records that fit the project criteria (over 18, with learning disabilities and multiple long-term health conditions), health conditions over time (for example; diabetes, asthma), and factors that may affect health (for example; smoking). No individuals are identified in the data. The team are also undertaking reviews to make sure that nothing is missed out and all data equally considered (no bias or mitigating circumstances).
- Participant events After the project was given ethical approval by the NHS in March, we were finally able to start asking the public for help, talking to people with intellectual disabilities (ID), carers and health professionals (April to June):
 - Navjot held group meetings with healthcare professionals asking them about what a good dashboard would look like (IT screen showing ID healthcare information to a GP or hospital worker).
 - Alison held a group meeting with people with learning disabilities and their carers asking them what visual information would help them to understand healthcare information.

 Cecilia - has been meeting individuals with learning disabilities, carers, social care and healthcare professionals to better understand health issues and experiences.
